## Secretary Donald Rumsfeld

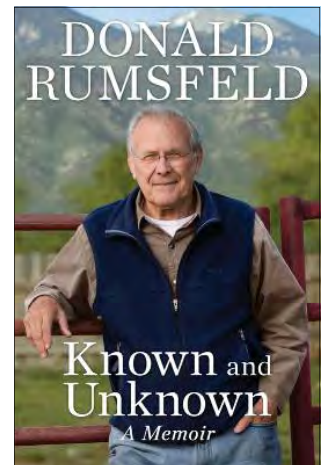
*Discusses His New Book  
"Known and Unknown"  
with  
Richard Norton Smith  
at the  
Gerald R. Ford  
Presidential Museum*

On March 7, 2011 the Gerald R. Ford Presidential Museum welcomed two friends of President Ford, Donald Rumsfeld and Richard Norton Smith. The two engaged in a lively and in-depth discussion of Mr. Rumsfeld's new book, *Known and Unknown*. The evening opened with Foundation Chairman, Steven Ford, addressing the capacity crowd before turning the program over to Mr. Rumsfeld and Mr. Smith, who jokingly asked Mr. Rumsfeld how it felt to have his book ranked above that of his former boss' (George W. Bush) book on the *New York Times* bestseller list.

Mr. Rumsfeld recalled his time in the Ford administration, especially the early days, shortly after President Nixon's resignation. Mr. Rumsfeld discussed the difficulties in making the transition between administrations in a short, unexpected time frame and his role as a close advisor to President Ford and later as his White House Chief of Staff.

Mr. Smith asked about today's military and whether a draft would ever be re-established in this country. Mr. Rumsfeld believed that the volunteer armed forces would stay in place and doubted that a draft would ever again be a viable option for our nation.

A question from the audience asked about the mood in the White House during the evacuation of Saigon, when North Vietnamese forces captured the city. Mr. Rumsfeld recalled that it was a somber setting. It was especially hard on President Ford, who had recently requested additional funds from Congress to evacuate all of the Vietnamese who were loyal to the United States. Congress turned down the request, making President Ford the angriest that Mr. Rumsfeld had ever seen him.

Mr. Smith inquired about President Eisenhower's concern about the "military industrial complex" and how it might threaten the peace and security of our form of government. Might President Eisenhower's warning merit our attention? Mr. Rumsfeld did not think this should be a major concern as he felt there were safeguards in place to protect against any undue influence from the military industrial complex.

*Known and Unknown* is a memoir recounting the remarkable life of a person who was close to the center of power in America over the last forty years. Mr. Rumsfeld served as Secretary of Defense under the Ford and George W. Bush administrations, and serves as a trustee of the Gerald R. Ford Presidential Foundation. One of the primary sources of his memoir was the Gerald R. Ford Presidential Library which houses the papers and records of President Ford and his administration.

Richard Norton Smith served as the director of the Ford Museum for five years after being the director of three other presidential libraries. He is a well known presidential historian, author and frequent guest on network television. Both Mr. Rumsfeld and Mr. Smith delivered eulogies at the funeral service for President Ford in Grand Rapids in 2007. ~ Jim Kratsas, Deputy Director, Gerald R. Ford Presidential Museum.

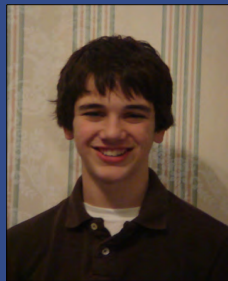

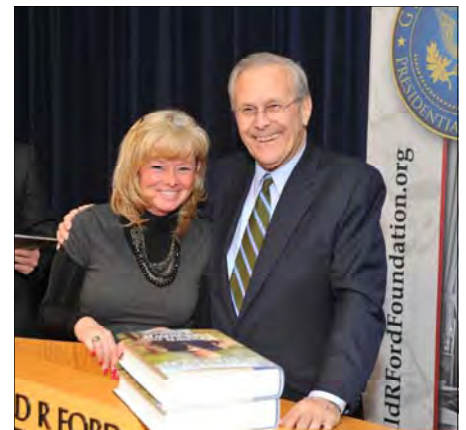

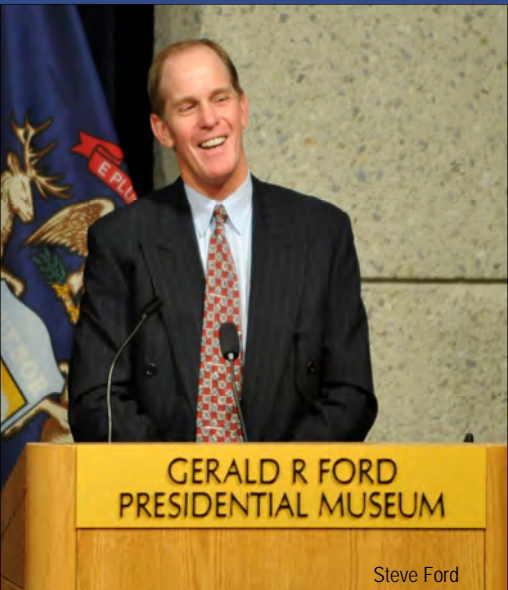

## Introduction of Secretary Donald Rumsfeld and Richard Norton Smith

I bring great wishes from mom and the family. We are so proud of the Trustees and *Friends of Ford* that are here tonight, and the community. Mom is excited that a great friend of the Ford Family is here, Secretary Rumsfeld. I want to tell you two quick anecdotes about Secretary Rumsfeld.

When I was a kid in the White House, just 18 years old, I used to go over to the West Wing all the time and there were two people in the administration that I will tell you were the nicest to all the children in the family. The first one was General Brent Scowcroft and the second one was Secretary Rumsfeld. They always had a kind word for you. They would stop, they chatted and wanted to find out what was going on in your life and as an 18 year old kid walking around the White House you appreciated that. I didn't really know Secretary Rumsfeld, I got to know him a little later in life, but as an 18 year old living in the White House I very much appreciated that he took some time to focus on us kids.

The other story I would like to share is about a month before Dad passed away. On Thanksgiving, we just had a nice Thanksgiving with Dad, I was with him down in Palm Springs, and Secretary Rumsfeld and his wife Joyce made the effort to see Dad on Thanksgiving. It meant so much to Dad that they would take time from their family vacation and Thanksgiving to come over and see him. He brought a cap with him from the USS Gerald R Ford, the aircraft carrier that is being named after Dad. I will just never forget what a smile it put on my Dad's face when I told him, "Dad, Secretary Rumsfeld is coming in the front door" and I heard my dad yell "Rummy" and you just knew that it brought back a lot of memories. What a true friendship they shared, not just a working relationship, but a true, true friendship and the Ford family is truly grateful to the Rumsfelds.

I would also like to introduce Richard Norton Smith. Many of you know him as an expert presidential historian. He used to be the Director of this Museum and Library. I was talking with him backstage and I think Richard said he had been the director of 5 or 6 libraries or museums and now works at George Mason University and you see him on television all the time. It's my pleasure to introduce Secretary Donald Rumsfeld and Richard Norton Smith.

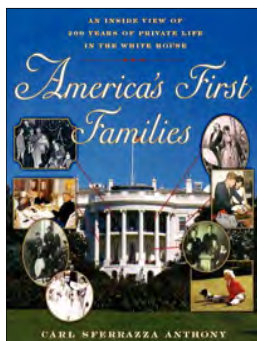

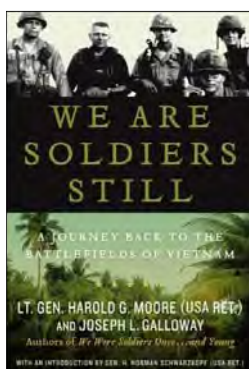
**Ken Walsh**

Journalist and author Ken Walsh treated audiences at both the Museum and Library to a glimpse inside his recently published book, *Family of Freedom: Presidents and African Americans in the White House*. The book, Ken's fifth, explores the centuries-old relationship between the two - from slaves to confidants and advisors, staff and Cabinet members, concluding with our nation's 44th president, Barack Obama. Ken is the chief White House correspondent for *U.S. News and World Report*, and three-time winner of the Foundation's annual prize for Distinguished Reporting on the Presidency. In researching *Family of Freedom*, Ken used the resources of the Gerald R. Ford Presidential Library as well as a White House interview with President Obama.

**Joe Galloway**  
"The American Soldier"

March, 16, 2011

The Gerald R. Ford Presidential Museum opened a special exhibit titled *The American Soldier*. The exhibit is curated by Cyma Rubin of Business of Entertainment, Inc. (New York). It traces the history of soldiers in nine wars, from the Civil War to Iraq and Afghanistan, through more than 100 photographs taken by wartime photographers. That evening, reporter and author, Joe Galloway, spoke to an auditorium filled with veterans and others. Co-authored with General Hal Moore of the best seller *We Were Soldiers Once...and Young* and its sequel, *We Are Soldiers Still*, Galloway talked about his experiences covering multiple tours in Vietnam and battlefields as recent as Iraq. Called by General Norman Schwarzkopf, "a soldiers' reporter and a soldiers' friend," Galloway is the only civilian to whom the U.S. Army awarded a medal for valor. He earned a Bronze Star for bravery shown at the battle of Ia Drang, in 1965. Galloway fielded questions from the audience and received a standing ovation as the evening ended.

Letter from the Library and Museum Director, Elaine K. Didier

Your membership in Friends of Ford enables the Ford Presidential Foundation to provide financial support for many of the public programs and educational activities presented by the Ford Presidential Library and Museum. The Museum Liaison and Foundation Programs Committee plays an important role in suggesting ideas for future programs, particularly the Simon lectureships, and our staff work hard to coordinate scheduling and travel details with speakers and historical interpreters to offer a wide range of events at both sites.

Over the past year, there were a total of eight programs at the Library and 22 speakers and other events at the Museum. Some programs were presented in conjunction with our feature exhibits on the *Cold War* (former spies Peter Earnest and Oleg Kalugin, and LBJ Library Director Mark Updegrove), *Schoolhouse to*

*White House* (Dick and Steve Ford) and *Betty Ford* (Susan Ford Bales) at the Museum, and *President Ford's Visit to Mao's China* at the Library (former Press Secretary Ron Nessen). Other programs featured historians or authors of new books on Justice Antonin Scalia (Joan Biskupic) and Abraham Lincoln (Ron White).

In addition to the two programs noted above, four other programs featured outstanding presentations by Ford Presidential Foundation trustees: Benton Becker reviewed President Ford's first 100 days in office, with a focus on the pardon and the Nixon tapes, Hank Meijer discussed his research on Senator Vandenburg, David Hume Kennerly led a program featuring four White House photographers, and Red Cavaney discussed election night 1976.

The Library presented a program on the past

and future of presidential libraries as a part of the University of Michigan Theme Semester on Museums, featuring Sharon Fawcett, Assistant Archivist for Presidential Libraries. It also hosted Ambassador Sichan Siv who discussed his book *Golden Bones*, describing his survival and journey from Cambodia's killing fields.

Several programs were presented in collaboration with the Hauenstein Center for Presidential Studies at Grand Valley State University, including programs on Abraham Lincoln (Ron White), the Vietnam War (Jim Hodges), mental health issues (former First Lady Rosalynn Carter) and voter volatility (John Hockenberry).

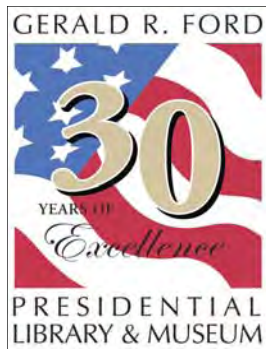
